<p align="center">Level 3</p> <p align="center">Analyzing and Emergent Evaluating</p> <p align="center">Compare, contrast and experiment by differentiating, organizing and identifying attributes</p>	<p align="center">Level 4</p> <p align="center">Evaluating and Creating</p> <p align="center">Critically reflects on knowledge and application, thinks creatively about knowledge to solve problems, ensures policies and practices are aligned with research-based best practices, combines concepts and/or components to develop original ideas and new ways of looking at and understanding elements</p>
